First-Time Budget!

Budget Items:

- 9.49 for Labels
- 183.92 for Aluminum Pans and Lids

Presentation Details:

- Goes to Bruff Sunday through Thursday and collect food that would have been thrown away. Leave it for the New Orleans mission workers to pick up
- Need aluminum containers as a stop-gap measure in case of extenuating circumstances. Supply 1/3 of food for the shelters. "Band-aid containers"
- Seeking sustainability, would usually use the reusable. These aluminum containers would be for emergency situations.
- Use about 15 pans/night. Would solve situations over the course of the year.
- Labels are necessary so that the mission can see what food they are getting, since the pans are not transparent
- Bruff cut off aluminum container supply

Debate Details:

- Cool thing, not a lot of money. They might not even need the budget next year. Emergencies.

Budget Items:

- 500 in Food for Habitat Builds (100 Decrease)
- 100 in Membership

Presentation Details:

- Food for builders. Not exclusive, everyone is invited to the builds.
- Membership makes the org a campus chapter organization
- 10ish at builds, up to 30. 4-5 builds per semester. 2 builds last semester with PAD and Theta. Intend to build this semester with PAD, Dems, etc.

- Use Motor Pool through CACTUS for build transport
- Special order food for people with dietary restrictions

Debate Details:

- Cut themselves, obviously they're aware of what they need
- Good at collaborating with other clubs

Rotaract

Total Requested: 575

Last Year Received: 400

Budget Items:

- 500 for Food Incentives for Service (300 Increase)
- 75 for Transportation before CACTUS Transport Funding

Presentation Details:

- Service organization partnered with Rotary at Riverbend. Weekly service events every weekend of the school year.
- Events open to everyone who wants to participate, hopefully to get people involved in different events.
- About 3 events before October 1, need money for travel. Confused about "iffy on transportation before October 1". Don't need it, didn't understand
- Were unable to spend budget money, advisor left. Requests have been going unanswered
- Use the food to engage with people who participate at events
- About 50 active members, with each event capped at around 15 based on nature of service
- Advertising via Facebook, Orgsync, email list
- Added to food in order to reallocate what they received toward food

Debate Details:

- It was a problem with their advisor, but alarming that they have had so many events and have spent no money.
- Definitely do not need the \$75
- Keep food at the same for the budget? \$200
- Increase the food budget they received, but cut the total budget? \$300
- Considering they have a lot of events, \$400?

Food Justice Advocates

Total Requested: 1000

Last Year Received: 850

Budget Items:

- 600 in Supplies (same)
- 400 in Honoraria (150 increase, same request)

Presentation Details:

- Combination of Food for Thought and Action and Hope Gardens
- Work to promote sustainability and empower communities through agriculture. Increasing awareness of New Orleans as a food desert
- Have not used a lot of the money yet: hoping to do a garden build in April with GreenLight NOLA, about \$400. Want the club to have something to look forward to every week into next year
- Doing a panel in partnership with Green Club, will be using leftover Green Club honoraria. Want to bring in people from New Orleans to speak about their experiences.
- Different supplies: water for farm volunteers, pots, art supplies, etc.
- This year's honoraria would possibly go toward another smaller panel, hoping to plan that starting next week. Want to develop opportunities to build for next year.
- Priority in Supplies, but hope to build up into Honoraria
- Co-Programming Fund! Definitely an opportunity
- Most of the supplies are one-time use, especially as they work with specific farms

Debate Details:

- Keep their budget the same? 850; 0-14-1
- Do they even need their honoraria? They should use co-programming.
- What do they actually do? Working with microfarms: requires donations for volunteers since it's a cost for the staff member. ~~600~~
- Should we be cutting their budget when they have clear intentions for it? But they didn't do anything with it this year either. 400?

Total Requested: 300

Last Year Received: 450

Budget Items:

- 300 in Food (100 Decrease)

Presentation Details:

- Every semester sponsors a child in a third-world country with congenital heart disease, raise \$1000 for surgery
- Look towards new fundraising opportunities like restaurants, business sponsorships. Hoping to grow off campus into New Orleans (can't use Venmo anymore), generally earn \$1000+ per semester
- Hope to have more events and more frequent events
- Part of a national organization; that's how they get in contact with the child and raise the money to go directly to the child
- Food before has come out of pocket, donations to the chapter for celebration
- NOT Zeta Psi. Never has been, currently increasing outreach.
- Hope to set up for a good semester this year
- Food DOES increase the amount of money that gets raised. Want to find marketing giveaways to better promote the organization. Not a sale thing, it's always optional and about increasing awareness

Debate Details:

- Propose \$0. They have been functioning fine without money
- But they did talk about plans to take on another child for next year
- If we fund food then donations would all go straight to the kids and no money on food
- Should fund them some, they weren't aware that they didn't have money. Food gave them more. 150.
- Area of growth for the coming semester is working with external sponsors. We don't need to give them money.
- 200 on the table. Give them the chance to spend the 450 they got this year. 7-8-0

Tulane Lives Beyond Breast Cancer

Total Requested: 500

Last Year Received: 350

Budget Items:

- 100 in Copying (new)
- 150 in Printing (50 Increase)
- 250 in Food (same)

Presentation Details:

- Breast cancer education and outreach
- Copying for informational/educational brochures and pamphlets. For Yoga on the Quad to teach about signs and symptoms of breast cancer
- Printing for the Helping Hand program: reach out to mothers with breast cancer, take care of their kids while they go to appointments, etc.
 - 250 copies: 50 copies for the club, 50 each for 3 cancer centers, and 50 misc.
- Money for Food for Yoga on the Quad, pizza, water, and snacks. Any leftover would go to snacks for kids at the Helping Hand would go.
- This past year, Yoga on the Quad was rained out. Spent only 200-250.
- Aware of SOC Printing, but want to make nice colored copies
- Helping Hand is new, hoping for outreach outside Tulane more so going into next year. Tulane becomes a designated space for kids once every two weeks: LBC downstairs or Pocket Park.
- Membership around 65 people
- Yoga on the Quad will happen this semester, likely in April. 50-60 Tulane students, \$10 entrance plus money from T-shirts, etc. Usually 100-110 total attendees.

Debate Details:

- Haven't spent any money. \$200, 100 in Food and 100 in Printing. Haven't had Yoga on the Quad yet, give them a chance to spend some in food.
- 350: Same budget as last year; 2-13-0
- No specific numbers on cost for Yoga on the Quad: 300, cut them a little bit.
 - 250 in Food, 50 in Printing
 - 200 in Food, 100 in Printing
