Presentation Details:

- TurboVote was used in the 2016 Presidential Election to help students register to vote. \$1000 to set up the program to use in the midterm election. Issues with other funding sources: 769 students voted through this app
- 2 public meetings for voter registration (50 printing and 400 of food)
- Brought a speaker from the New Orleans Abortion Fund this semester
- Promotional material for election knowledge and know your rights pins
- Hoping to fund two trips, Pensacola (lobbying) and the state capital (for learning, touring, etc)
- Want to put forward the idea of the Pensacola trip, but they need to go through travel
- Student affairs funded for the Presidential election, unlikely to be funded for the midterms in 2018
- Priority for TurboVote and speakers
- Spent 0? Will have spent 350/400 through speaker events that just happened, will happen this month

Debate Details:

- 1400: TurboVote and Honoraria at the same level of last year
- Won't need paper forms if they use the app program

- 1550: same budget (plus 150 in Food) but plus TurboVote; 5-6-1 (broken by Tyler because he is right-wing just kidding Tyler is liberal for the record)
- 1400: TurboVote plus 200 in Food and 200 in Speakers

Budget Items:

- 1000 for Interview Prep Guides
- 1000 for Pillars of Wall Street Workshop

Presentation Details:

- Largest finance club on campus, over 200 members. 650 members on Facebook, current students and recent alumni
- Weekly meetings to talk about recent news and trends in the market, run by upperclassmen with finance experience and internships
- Preparing freshmen and sophomores to get investment banking skills and internships
- Sophomore workshop to help sophomores gain skills and internships
- Important prep guides to teach technical skills
- Financial workshops in modeling, same company that teaches the bank trainings. Hoping to subsidize costs for members interested in those workshops
- Green Bull has taken more and more steps to help students achieve these internships and jobs
- Workshops every year, prep guides every 2 or 3 years. Hoping to build a library of resources
- Guides are kind of a set cost, subsidizing would be extra
- Looking toward fundraising through alumni
- Prep guides give you interview skills that you can't get for free

Debate Details:

- Fund in Full: They need those programs for career success in the business school
- Should they look into the Turchin library? The Turchin library sucks
- The finance career center is not all that helpful. It's huge to send people to these internships and these events. Finance students learn SO MUCH through practical experience. We don't want students who can't pay the fee to get access to the workshops.
- 500: 250 in each.
- Supplemental to help finance students get jobs
- 1000: 500 in each
- 1500: 750 in each

Presentation Details:

- National organization in Oakland California. Works to make things environmentally friendly. Our chapter hopes to work toward SISE goals
- Bring in local speakers that work toward entrepreneurship: app developers, CEOs, etc.
- Work to connect students trying to start non-profits with professionals who can help them to do it
- Food is for one event, based on historical expense
- Hope to reimburse for travel so they can look beyond New Orleans for speakers

Presentation Details:

- Student-run complementary consulting group that helps small businesses in New Orleans through basic marketing, restructuring, research, finance, etc.
- Have worked with a handyman service, an energy drink
- Through the LePage Center

- Art supplies would be those beyond what the SOC provides: marketing to the rest of the student body
- Uber for site visits beyond having a vehicle
- Website necessary for company operations
- Use motor pool for local transportation
- Website takes priority over the supplies
- 100 covers the domain and any technical expenditures
- 60 members, \$15 per person in dues, hoping to get everyone to pay dues
- Dues used for research, T-shirts, fundraising
